3. Reports-

- a. **Vice Chairman** – Mr. Slavin welcomed all to the meeting and asked that everyone please stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.
- b. **Executive Director-** Mr. Walker referenced that he would be brief so that everyone could get home for the Bruins game. He encouraged that anyone with nominations for 2018 Awards to please get them in as soon as possible as the Nominating/Awards Committee would soon be meeting to make their selections.

4. Consent Agenda

- a. **Regional Reviews-** Ms. Conaty referred the members to the ENF section of the packet.

Project Title/Location: Somerset/Fairfield Commons

Address: 500 Grand Army of the Republic Highway (Route 6), Somerset, MA

Project Proponent: Marc Landry, South Coast Hospitality, LLC

Project Description: The proposed project includes the development of four (4) commercial buildings totaling 30,800 sq. ft. with associated parking and underground infrastructure on 14.47-acre parcel along the north side of the Grand Army of the Republic Highway (Route 6) in Somerset. The wetlands delineation on the site was approved by Somerset Conservation Commission through the issuance of an Order of Resource Area Delineation.

2. **Project Title/Location:** Fairhaven/Seawall Improvements for a Residential Property

Address: 16 Wilbur's Point Drive, Fairhaven, MA

Project Proponent: Sherry L. Gomes

Project Description: The proposed project includes work that will commence with the removal of the remains of the concrete foundation for the house, work which has been permitted through the issuance of an Order of Conditions (OOC) under DEP File NO SE 23-1247. OOC also permitted the reconstruction of a new single family dwelling. The excavated hole will be filled with clean gravel and utilized as the staging area for a crane or excavator to then perform the seawall improvement work.

5. Committee Reports-

a. **Finance Committee-** Mr. Callahan mentioned that the Finance Committee met on April 11, 2018. The March 20, 2018 Finance and personnel meeting minutes were approved, Treasurer's Report for March 2018 received, and a warrant for expenses approved in the amount of \$33,357.29.

Mr. Callahan indicated that the committee received and reviewed the OPEB Trust Account statement. He stated that SRPEDD is still waiting on final closeout statement from Bristol County Savings Bank of the BCSB FSA merger with the Taunton Raymond James affiliate, headed by Lou Ricciardi.

He mentioned that the FFY18 Q3 budget update was approved as well.

A motion was made and seconded to approve to place the March Treasurers report on file. VOTED UNANIMOUSLY.

b. **Personnel Committee-** Mr. Callahan mentioned that the Personnel Committee met on April 11, 2018, to review and discuss draft updates to the agency's personnel policies with Mary Aicardi, HR consultant, from UMass Boston Collins Center.

Mr. Callahan reported that there was a proposed Salary adjustment of up 3% to include team and individual merit increases based on annual performance evaluations. He indicated that the committee went into executive session to conduct the executive director's annual performance review.

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A motion was made and seconded to approve to place on file the Personnel committee report from the month of March. VOTED UNANIMOUSLY.

- c. **RESC-** A motion was made and seconded and approved to place the RESC report on file. VOTED UNANIMOUSLY.
- d. **Joint Transportation Planning Group/SMMPO-** Mr. Mission reported that staff is currently working on the draft 2019-2023 TIP and UPWP for release and endorsement at the SMMPO meeting on May 15, 2018. Mr. Mission mentioned that the SMMPO has a vacancy, following the recent election in Middleborough in which Selectman (and MPO Member) Steve McKinnon was not reelected. Referring Commissioners to the bylaws, he explained that there will be a self-nomination form mailed out shortly for the vacant selectmen position on the MPO and that Commissioners could decide, via a change in the bylaws (as talked about a year or so back following a similar vacancy) either to open it up to all eligible BOS candidates, for example, or have Middleboro appoint a BOS member to serve the remainder of Mr. McKinnon's term. Vice-Chairman Slavin asked that Commissioners give thought to the matter in advance of a vote to be held next meeting, on May 23.

A motion was made and seconded and approved to place the JTPG/SMMPO report on file. VOTED UNANIMOUSLY.

7. Old Business-

- a. **Technical Assistance/DLTA Update-** Ms. Conaty referred Commissioners to the technical assistance report in the handout, as well as a the DLTA handout with list of 2018 project funding recipients. She encouraged that people give a call with any questions.
- b. **Marine Technology Corridor Innovation update-** Mr. Walker updated the Commission on the latest developments with regard to development of the draft Marine Technology Corridor proposal since the last meeting; referring members to both a draft scope of work that had been prepared and draft letter of support on behalf of the Commission for the Board's consideration. Commissioners read over the letter and made the following motion.

A motion was made and seconded send the letter of support for the Southeastern Marine Technology Corridor to EDA. VOTED UNANIMOUSLY.

Among other enthusiastic discussion regarding the promise of the Marine Technology Corridor proposal, Mr. Costa asked if any of the area's higher education institutions (beyond proposal partner UMass-Dartmouth) had been contacted as yet. Mr. Walker responded that there had been some preliminary inquiries made of several RI institutions, prior to Rhode Island electing to hold off until later stages of the initiative, and others to follow, if funded. Mr. Whitin inquired about the match requirement. Mr. Walker mentioned that the match is 1:1 and is being pursued by key partners Hugh Dunn and Toby Stapleton from UMass-Dartmouth. Vice Chairman Slavin stressed the enormous possibilities of the initiative as had been shared, and closed by saying that staff would keep Commissioners apprised.

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c. **Wed, 5/23 Annual Meeting at Rachel's Lakeside in Dartmouth-** Mr. Walker reminded that online registration is now open for the upcoming 2018 Annual Meeting (also possible to call/email Stacy to reserve a seat), and that he looked forward to seeing everyone there.

- 1. Project Title/Location:** Riverfront Business Park-Freetown
Address: South Main Street, Freetown, MA
Project Proponent: Riverfront Business Park, LLC., 10 Green Street, Providence, RI
Project Description: This project will feature approximately 280,100 sf of office space, a 61,600 sf supermarket, 82,300 sf of retail space, 23,635 sf of restaurant space, an 82,200 sf key hotel, 75 residential apartments, 400,400 sf greenhouse space and 1,732,700 sf industrial space, for a total of approximately 2.75 million square feet of development. The allocation of their uses into 28 specific structures remains identical to what was represented in the DEIR.
- 2. Project Title/Location:** Proposed Retail Motor Fuel Outlet Development-Taunton
Address: 148 North Walker Street
Project Proponent: South coast Development, LLC
Project Description: The project site consists of 80,001 sf of land located at the northeast corner of the intersection of North Walker Street and Winthrop Street in Taunton. The site is bordered by a residential apartment building and commercial warehouse to the north, an automobile sale to the east, a commercial building for a psychic and a convenience store located across Winthrop Street to the south, and a Dunkin' Donuts and residential single and multifamily homes across North Walker Street to the west.

Presentation: Michele Paul, Director of Resilience and Environmental Stewardship, City of New Bedford, Payne /Elco redevelopment project. Michele provided the committee with a project overview and the various fund acquired by the city to clean-up the site for public solicitation and redevelopment. Michele discussed the public engagement process and re-use scenarios. Relative to economic development Sid Wainer & Son Produce and Specialty Foods is interested in acquiring the site for re-use as greenhouse space to support a recent \$12ML expansion of their adjacent facility. The project would provide limited job growth by support nearly 600 retention jobs at the site, as well as at locations in Dartmouth and Rochester. Currently the city, with assistance from SRPEDD is developing a proposal to EDA to improve infrastructure around the site for transportation access and safety.

Old Business:

- CEDS 2018 Update: draft Chap VII discussed. The committee was instructed to review revisions and provide comment for June 13, 2018 meeting at which time draft document including revised Chaps 2, 4, 6 & 7 will be consolidated, and undergo final review and comment. Following this final review, the committee will vote to recommend approval of the document to the SRPEDD commission at their June 27, 2018.
- Update from Karen Harraghy (for Mary Waldron) on Skills Gap Initiative as well as other activities underway at BSU IPARE (Institute of Policy Analysis and Regional Engagement).

SOUTHEASTERN MASSACHUSETTS METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION (SMMPO):

Procedure for Electing Board of Selectmen Representatives:

- a. The Southeastern Massachusetts Metropolitan Planning Commission (SMMPO) consists of thirteen members representing the following:
 - i. Secretary of Transportation
 - ii. Commissioner of the Massachusetts Highway Department
 - iii. Chairman of the Southeastern Regional Planning and Economic Development District (SRPEDD) Commission
 - iv. Administrator of the Southeastern Regional Transit Authority (SRTA)
 - v. Administrator of the Greater Attleboro Taunton Regional Transit Authority (GATRA)
 - vi. Mayors of Attleboro, Fall River, New Bedford and Taunton
 - vii. Members of four Boards of Selectmen in the SRPEDD Region to be elected by the SRPEDD Commission.

In accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) relating to the comprehensive, continuing and cooperative transportation planning process, the SRPEDD Commission is authorized to elect the four representatives of Boards of Selectmen utilizing the procedure described below.

- b. Term of Office: Two representatives shall be elected each year for two-year terms. Elections shall be held annually in the month of June.
- c. Solicitation of Nominees: Annually the SRPEDD Commission shall send notices to the Board of Selectmen and SRPEDD Commissioners of each of its member towns. The purpose and role of the SMMPO and a description of the election process shall accompany the notice. Each member of every local Board of Selectmen from member communities, shall be offered an opportunity to nominate themselves as a candidate for election to the SMMPO. Nominations shall be returned to SRPEDD within four weeks of the date they are distributed. Nomination forms are typically distributed by the second week of the month of May.
- d. Election of Selectmen Representatives: Nominations shall be referred to the SRPEDD Commission for a vote at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Commission in the month of **June**. All names and towns of the interested selectmen shall be printed on a paper ballot. Nominees will be invited to attend and speak at the meeting of the SRPEDD Commission when the vote is taken.
- e. Designees: Board of Selectmen members elected to the SMMPO may send a designee to a meeting in their place. The designee may vote only with written and signed authorization from the elected SMMPO member.

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- f. Vacancies: Should a selectmen's position fall vacant between annual elections, any member town may nominate, and the SRPEDD Commission may elect, a candidate to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term...

-OR-

- g. Vacancies: Should a selectmen's position fall vacant between annual elections, the represented town for that vacancy may nominate, and the SRPEDD Commission may elect, a candidate from that town's board of selectmen to temporarily fill the vacancy until the following election.
